Boosting a Six-year Old's Spirits

Living in the indigenous community of Poblado Miguel Aleman, six-year-old Miguelito (Miguel) Cruz often visited the community center. Although shy, likely due to his crossed eyes, he was always cheerful and smiling. Thanks to compassionate community leaders and volunteers, coupled with M.O.S.T.'s surgeons' expertise, Miguel's spirit and outlook now shines brighter.

Miguel's mother, who raises four children on her own, was contacted by a local social worker when she heard M.O.S.T. was coming to the nearby city of Hermosillo. Local service volunteers from Ayudarnos
Unos a Otros drove Miguel and his mother, who lacked life transportation, to the M.O.S.T. clinic more than 40 minutes away, to ensure he would be considered for surgery.

Olga stayed true to her commitment. Ten years and ten M.O.S.T. missions later, she continues to bring a large suitcase completely stuffed with socks, underwear, headbands and slippers donated from friends, family and coworkers, who support her efforts.

"The children are often unsure and crying as we help dress and prepare them for surgery," Olga says. "The gifts we provide help distract them and ease their anxieties."



Olga recalls a patient she will never forget — a little girl who was thrilled to get underwear with pictures of the "Frozen" princesses. "She was so excited, she put them on under her gown right away. Then she opened the back of her gown and proudly walked up and down the hallway so everyone could see her new underwear," says Olga. "These gifts may seem small, but they are huge in the eyes of the patients we serve and I am grateful to be able to add to their M.O.S.T. experience."

M.O.S.T. Miracles in Mexico

MoreLiA 2018

In October 2018, M.O.S.T. visited Morelia, in the Mexican state of Michoacan. It was the seventh week-long clinic in the city since the first M.O.S.T. trip there, in 1995.

Working in partnership with local hospitals and Rotary volunteers, the M.O.S.T. team of 48 doctors, nurses, pharmacists and other volunteers provided care to more than 165 patients. Several prior M.O.S.T. patients have become volunteers and were there to show gratitude and provide assistance, as well.

During this mission, the team performed various plastic surgeries, urological and general surgeries to correct cleft lips and palates, crossed eyes, burn scars, extra fingers and toes, and other medical conditions. The team was also able to treat many returning M.O.S.T. patients, who needed follow-up plastic surgeries.



In May 2019, M.O.S.T. traveled to Hermosillo, the 16th largest city in Mexico, that is centrally located in the northwestern Mexican state of Sonora. It was the first visit to the city and the need was overwhelming. In the first week that the advertisement for the M.O.S.T. clinic was posted, more than 500 applied.

The three-day schedule was tight and required the efficiency, precision, and teamwork, for which M.O.S.T. is known. With a team of 31 doctors, nurses, pharmacists and other volunteers, M.O.S.T. arrived at the clinic in Hermosillo at 11 a.m. on May 2 and were conducting clinic screenings and setting up the operating room suite an hour later.

The short mission was filled with many miracles. From dawn to dusk, M.O.S.T. worked tirelessly to care for as many patients as resources would allow. Together, with the extraordinary organizational and logistical support that the local Beltrones Foundation provided, the team performed a staggering 102 corrective eye surgeries and distributed 50 sets of eyeglasses.

Unfortunately, not everyone who traveled to the clinic could be seen. Although M.O.S.T. helped to provide greater vision, confidence and outlooks for many of the young patients, the team had to turn many away. M.O.S.T. hopes to return to Hermosillo in the future to provide corrective care to those who didn't receive it.

sAn CrisTobAL de LAs CAsAs 2019

In October 2019, a group of 60 M.O.S.T. volunteers went to San Cristobal de las Casas, Chiapas, Mexico. It was the second week-long clinic in the city and the team performed 262 surgeries to correct cleft lips and palates, crossed eyes, burn scars, remove extra fingers and toes, and provide surgery for children with hernias. They also provided eyeglasses for 40 patients.

Many of the patients were indigenous — traveling from the local mountains — and spoke the native languages of Tzotzil. To overcome communication challenges, local volunteers generously offered their time to help translate the five different dialects of the region. Local Rotarians also greatly assisted in the efforts.

Transforming Futures through Corrective Care



orn with a cleft palate, two-year-old Veronica endured a life of heartache and rejection. Her father abandoned their family after her birth, leaving Veronica's mother to raise five children on her own, in the mountains near the Mexican state of Tabasco. But, thanks to M.O.S.T., her supportive family and a twist of fate, Veronica's future is destined to be brighter.

Ahead of M.O.S.T.'s October 2019 mission to San Cristobal de las Casas, Chiapas, Mexico, news was spreading about the opportunity to receive transformational surgical care for children in need. Thankfully, Veronica's uncle heard about M.O.S.T. through a coworker and accompanied the child and her mother as they traveled more than 10 hours from their indigenous village for the chance to be selected for life-changing surgery. The first two hours of their journey was by foot to the nearest bus station.

Veronica was evaluated by M.O.S.T. plastic surgeon, Dr. Brian Mailey, and selected as a patient. If Veronica did not receive surgery to correct her cleft palate during the M.O.S.T. mission, her family would not have another opportunity to seek help for the child. It was now or likely, never.

Thanks to M.O.S.T., Veronica's cleft palate was corrected and she recovered well from surgery. But, the compassion and generosity of our M.O.S.T. volunteers did not stop there. Veronica's family had been so determined not to miss this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity that they spent all of their money traveling to the clinic and had no funds to make the 10-hour trip home. Upon hearing of their situation, M.O.S.T. volunteers pooled together donations to fund the family's return trip.
