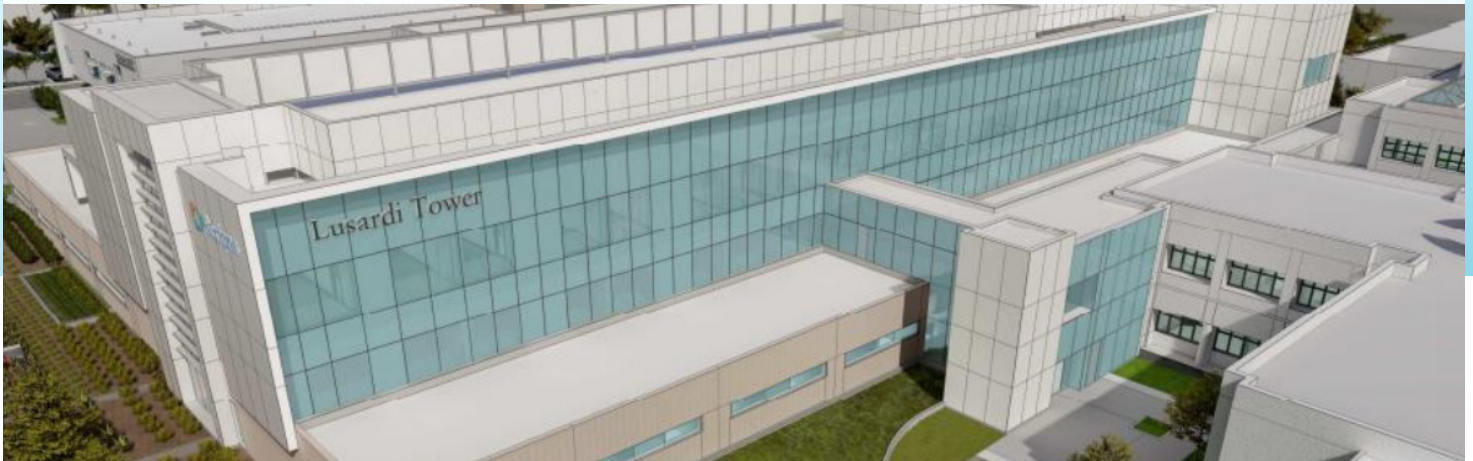

Innovative Hospital Tower Added to Growing Campus

Thanks to a generous \$25 million lead gift from Debbie and Warner Lusardi, Scripps Memorial Hospital Encinitas is beginning phase two of its master plan. The centerpiece is the Lusardi Tower, a new, 185,000-square-foot hospital building with 64 private inpatient rooms, surgical suites and a state-of-the-art intensive care unit. It will be equipped with the latest wireless technologies, flexible surgical suites, advanced digital monitoring and telemedicine capabilities, and includes:

- 20 observation rooms
- 14 perioperative beds
- 16 postpartum beds
- 36 private medical/surgical beds
- 16 intensive care beds
- 12 definitive observation unit beds, with the flexibility to adapt with daily census needs
- 6 operating rooms, including 1 hybrid operating room
- Cardiac catheterization lab
- Interventional pulmonary suite
- Interventional radiology suite
- 1 MRI and 1 additional CT

Scripps Encinitas also is creating a hub for pulmonary care with plans for the Lusardi Pulmonary Institute. Philanthropy will help expand on Scripps Encinitas' existing pulmonary expertise, with clinicians caring for patients with lung cancer, COPD, COVID-19, sleep disorders and other conditions.

Patient-Centered Care

In keeping with our focus on delivering the right care in the right setting, the plan takes into consideration changing patient-centered health care trends, such as

private patient rooms with designated family areas; nurse proximity to patients; the evolution of wireless technology and advanced equipment; and efficient use of natural resources.

The COVID-19 pandemic highlighted the importance of high-quality health care and investments in "smart" facilities and digital technologies. The evolution in technology has led to wireless and other medical advancements that are dramatically improving the efficiency and efficacy of treatments.



The three-story, 68,000-square-foot medical pavilion is part of our second phase of expansion on campus.

Medical Office Pavilion Offers

Added Convenience and Expanded Services

In addition to the plans for a hospital tower, a new medical office pavilion opened in 2021, which provides added convenience for patients. It includes new multidisciplinary clinic space for Scripps MD Anderson Cancer Center, as well as primary and specialty care physician offices.



The emergency department serves the booming north county communities with more than 37,000 visits in 2021.

Leichtag Foundation Critical Care Pavilion Serves Community

The first phase of the master plan, completed in 2016, includes the Leichtag Foundation Critical Care Pavilion, a 62,000-square-foot critical care building with a 38-bed emergency department, 36-private room inpatient unit and two upgraded surgical suites.
