A new hospital tower will be a centerpiece of expansion on the campus of Scripps Mercy Hospital, San Diego, in addition to other buildings including a cancer center and medical pavilion.

Innovative Hospital Tower to Serve Our Growing Community

The campus of Scripps Mercy Hospital is growing to continue to serve the diverse needs of our San Diego community. A new hospital tower will be built with state-of-the-art surgical suites and operating rooms, radiology suites, a labor and delivery and neonatal intensive care unit, and spacious private rooms.



Designated family areas offer comfortable and convenient waiting areas for friends and loved ones.



Nurses stations are in close proximity to patient rooms.

The new tower will include:

- 350 private rooms
- Intensive Care Unit
- Labor/Delivery and NICU floor - All women's services will move to the new tower, and will be served with a dedicated entry
- New surgery suites with two cardiac cath labs, EP lab, interventional radiology, one hybrid operating room and nine general surgery/operating rooms
- New helipad on the tower roof to improve flight patterns
- New cafeteria and to-go café

Patient-Centered Care

In keeping with our focus on delivering the right care in the right setting, the plan takes into consideration changing patient-centered health care trends, such as private patient rooms with designated family areas; nurse proximity to patients; the evolution of wireless technology and advanced equipment; and efficient use of natural resources.

The COVID-19 pandemic highlighted the importance of high-quality health care and investments in "smart" facilities and digital technologies. The evolution in technology has led to wireless and other medical advancements that are dramatically improving the efficiency and efficacy of treatments.

Medical Pavilion Adds Accessibility and Convenience

Additional philanthropy will play an exciting role in our growing campus expansion, educational programs and health care services. There are plans for a new parking structure as well as medical pavilion to support the campus which will include:

- Primary and specialty care physician offices
- Operating rooms
- Imaging center
- In-patient diagnostic support services
- Ambulatory services

Prebys Cancer Center's convenient location includes leading-radiation therapy equipment, a spacious infusion center and ample patient exam rooms for collaboration among multidisciplinary care teams.

Prebys Cancer Center Serves Community

Prebys Cancer Center at Scripps Mercy Hospital, San Diego, opened in fall 2021, to serve patients and families. Community support has been vital in providing a comprehensive range of cancer treatment and services at the center, and represents the first new construction in Scripps Mercy's master redevelopment plan. Part of Scripps MD Anderson Cancer Center, the 40,000-square-foot, four-story outpatient center is named in honor of the late Conrad Prebys, who, in 2016, pledged a \$20 million gift to name the center and a \$5 million gift for an endowed medical director position at Scripps MD Anderson Cancer Center.



The Woltman Family College Building, formerly the Mercy College of Nursing, and has been restored to provide patients with a variety of patient support services.

Woltman Family College Building: New Home for Support Services

Adjacent to the new cancer center, the Woltman Family College Building provides supportive services to patients and their families. Thanks to philanthropy, the building that served as a San Diego landmark and nursing school for generations of caregivers has been restored. It is now home to non-clinical programs and services, such as spiritual care services, integrative medicine, cancer survivorship program, palliative care and graduate medical education.
